UPH IN COOPERATION WITH KADIN AND INDOSAT HELD A DIALOGUE TITLED "FUTURE EDUCATION AND TECHNOLOGY"

Lippo Village (10 / 6) - At least 300,000 students and 850,000 Indonesian students graduated from educational institutions each year and are ready to enter employment. Unfortunately, most of them unemployed because of not able to meet industry needs. The main cause is a mismatch between the curriculums of educational institutions with industry needs.

This harsh reality encourages Universitas Pelita Harapan (UPH) in cooperation with the Indonesian Chamber of Commerce (Kamar Dagang Indonesia - KADIN), The Permanent Committee for Education Training and Internships, and Indosat hold a dialogue titled "Future Education and Technology". This event will discuss the proper way of adjusting the curriculum has been standardized with the government's current industrial needs.

Chairman of the Standing Committee of Education Training and Internships - Chamber of Commerce, Handito Joewono, in an interview with one of the previous educational magazine has suggested revision of education law in Indonesia to overcome this problem.
