Pandemic Does Not Stop UPH Medicine Students from Taking Their Hippocratic Oath

Amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, the Faculty of Medicine of Universitas Pelita Harapan (FK UPH) held its Hippocratic Oath Commencement for 146 doctors through a videoconference on March 16, 2020. This decision was taken as a response to the government's policy, especially the Open Letter from the Ministry of Education and Culture No. 3 of 2020 regarding COVID-19 preventive measures that must be taken by educational institutions to support the teaching and learning process in this emergency situation.

"In the middle of this pandemic, the Faculty of Medicine of UPH was able to send these new doctors who are ready to dedicate themselves to the community as COVID-19 volunteers. No matter where they are, these new doctors are always ready to realize their first oath as a doctor—to dedicate their lives for humanity. Their response was amazing. There were about 50 doctors, alumni of UPH Faculty of Medicine, who became volunteers in Siloam Hospitals," Prof. Dr. dr. Eka J. Wahjoepramono, Sp.BS., Ph.D., Dean of UPH Faculty of Medicine, stated after the commencement.

A number of UPH Faculty of Medicine's leaders, including Dr. dr. Cucunawangsih, Sp. Mk., Vice Dean of Research and Community Services, Dr. dr. Julius July, Sp. BS., M. Kes., Assistant to Dean of Clinical Education, dr. Andree Kurniawan, Sp. PD., Vice Dean of Student Affairs, Beverley Wonsono, BA., MA., Director of UPH Faculty of Medicine, and dr. Vito A. Damay, Sp. JP (K), M.Kes., as a representative of the alumni. In this event, two new doctors who had just graduated from UPH Faculty of Medicine also witnessed the procession. They were dr. Cindy Riani and dr. Wim

Pratama Wijaya, from the class of 2014. Out of the 146 doctors, 43 of them graduated with honors. For the National Competence for Indonesian Health Professionals (NACE), UPH has reached a passing rate of more than 97%. This achievement is certainly a great pride for us, this enables us to maintain our place as one of the universities in Indonesia with the best passing rate. Congratulations to 146 new doctors of UPH Faculty of Medicine! We are very of all of you who decided to dedicate your time to the lives of people as COVID-19 volunteers.

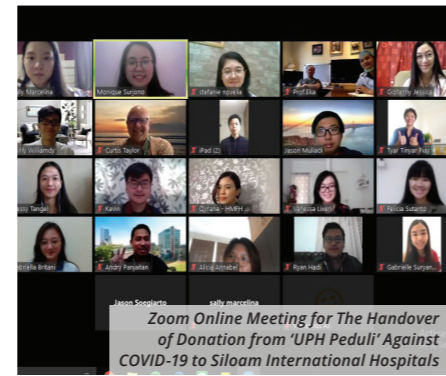

The Student Executive Board of UPH (BEM UPH) started a movement called 'UPH Peduli against COVID-19' as an act of solidarity for those who are badly impacted by the pandemic. This movement started with a fundraising event held from March 29 to April 8, 2020. This movement has successfully raised a total of Rp50.000.000 of fund which has been given to Siloam Hospitals and UNICEF (United Nations Emergency Children's Fund). According to BEM UPH's Head of Community Services Department, Monique Gabrielle Surjono (Psychology, 2017), the funds they

gave to Siloam Hospitals would be allocated to fulfill the need for Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and foods of medical personnel. In addition to that, the fund they gave to UNICEF would be allocated to fulfill the need for PPE in referral hospitals authorized by the Ministry of Health.

'UPH Peduli' also consisted of other activities such as preparing and sending medical volunteers and nurses, holding fundraising for medical personnel around the Tangerang area who have to deal with COVID-19 patients, and other non-academics as well as academic activities.

UPH Student Placed 1st in a Digital Marketing Competition 2020 in Taiwan



Angeline Kartika, an Information System student of Universitas Pelita Harapan (IS UPH), class of 2017, had just won 1st place in "The 5th Chong Yue Video Competition 2020" in Taiwan. Winning a competition is certainly not a new thing for students UPH students, but there is something interesting behind this particular achievement. These students exchanged their assignments in one of their classes at the School of Information Science and Technology (SISTech) UPH with their participation in this international competition. This was revealed by Dr. Andree Emmanuel Widjaja, Lecturer in Digital Marketing at Information System UPH who registered all students (class of 2017) to take part in this competition as in exchange for an assignment in his class.

"The main goal is to motivate and encourage my students to have more experience. I'm very satisfied with the works that all students have created, especially with Angeline had managed to win the competition. During the process, I assist them by facilitating their needs and ensuring them, that they are capable of this," said Dr. Andree.

This international competition was held by TOPCO Scientific Co., LTD., Taiwan, through an online process which started from August to December 2020. The winner was announced on March 3, 2020. The participants of this competition came from various countries and there was a total of 50 teams, with 4 members in each. In this competition, Angel had to collaborate with three other participants, they are Nguyen Thi Ngoc Thuy (Nutri), Master Student of IMBA National Cheng Kung University, Kethaya Vanna, Bachelor Degree Student of IBM Royal University of Phnom Penh, and Ren Pheareak, Bachelor Degree Student of IBM at the Royal University of Phnom Penh.

"In this Video Competition, each team has to choose one topic from a list of topics provided by the committee, and we choose to promote An Yong Xian Wu, a healthy food brand from TOPCO in Taiwan. This competition consisted of several stages. First, we start by analyzing the SWOT (Strength, Weakness, Opportunity, dan Threat) of the brand. Secondly, we have to create a video-based advertisement and choose the media channel for promotion, in which we chose Instagram. For the third stage, we have to create a proposal about our ideas through a video, and finally, we have to create a final report about our promotion video. The judges from TOPCO assessed our work through the number of viewers from the promotion video that we shared on YouTube," Angeline explained.

Angeline also admitted that throughout the process, she had to face a number of challenges while collaborating with students from other countries, starting from language barriers, cultural differences, and also time zone differences. However, Angela sees these barriers as an opportunity for her to learn to work efficiently regardless of the situation.

"In this competition, we have to analyze the social media that we will use for promotion and there are a lot of terms that are related to technology-based-promotion. This is not a new thing for me because in UPH we have learned about the technology utilization in business," said Angel.

However, Angel also admitted that aside from the lessons she got in class, the emotional support and motivation from her lecturers are equally important. Through this achievement, Dr. Andree also hopes that an opportunity like this can expand their knowledge and become a meaningful experience for them in the future.

UPH Faculty of Medicine Earns Valuable Lessons Amidst COVID-19 Pandemic

The growing outbreak of COVID-19 leads to very high demand for medical personnel all over Indonesia. Prof. Dr. dr. Eka J. Wahjoepramono, Sp.BS., Ph.D., Dean of Faculty of Medicine & Health Sciences UPH and the Head of Neuroscience Center and a neurosurgeon in Siloam International Hospitals, consider this moment as an opportunity to give clinical clerkship students some valuable lessons and an opportunity to get hands-on experience in the field where they're called for.

Through the COVID-19 volunteer program, Prof. Eka encourages students of the Profession Program of Medicine, who are in a clinical clerkship period, to participate as COVID-19 volunteers in Siloam Hospitals. Clinical clerkship students would only be assigned in certain areas according to the government's direction. They will be focused on preventive and promotive measures, tracing, and tracking. One special thing about the medical volunteers of UPH Faculty of Medicine is the briefing and training they received before being sent to the deal with COVID-19 patients. Some of them include treatments for regular and severe COVID-19 patients, intubation training and ventilator installation and adjustment, especially for patients in critical condition. These procedures should be done under the supervision of specialist doctors in Siloam Hospitals. Volunteers also went through some simulations with a complete set of equipment, to obtain the real experience.

Though still in training, these volunteers will surely obtain great lessons and extraordinary experiences compared to the normal registrar. Therefore, Prof. Eka hopes that through this rare opportunity, more clinical clerkship students can join forces and work together as volunteers, to help health care personnel because it will surely become a valuable experience for young doctors to learn about this pandemic.

UPH Product Design Alumnus Assembles Qualified PPE for Medical and Non-Medical Use



With the rising numbers of COVID-19 victims in Indonesia, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) has become crucial. According to the statement of President Jokowi during his video conference on March 30, 2020, Indonesia needs approximately 3 million PPE until the end of May 2020. The president encourages national companies that are capable of creating this equipment to

help. As a response towards this national emergency, Agnesia Cahaya, an alumnus of UPH Product Design (2015), decided to create her own line of PPE to fulfill the need for this equipment under her own brand, 'Cahaya Kurnia'.

Looking at the high demand for a proper yet affordable PPE, Agnes felt encouraged to create her own PPE product for medical and non-medical use. Certainly, at an affordable price, made from quality materials, durable, comfortable, and efficient.

"In the meantime, we are producing three kinds of masks: Acrylic Face Shield that was made from two-sized acrylics, Face Shield made from mica at a very affordable price, and a scuba-based mask to support the mask-wearing movement for the non-medical public. We also produce aerosol box for medical personnel, hazmat, and cashier barrier to maintain the safe distance. For medical PPE, we will try to provide orders that are adjustable to the needs of medical personnel's needs and requests. Moreover, for medical needs, we provide a special price and a free delivery rate for a certain amount of order," Agnes explained.

Agnes also added that she plans to sell her product to the public, factories, and also medical personnel, and so far, she has been getting positive responses. Agnes also said that she would not mind giving it out free for those in an urgent situation.

This motivation to aid for the need of others and become problem solvers has been taught and instilled in UPH students since their first years. Therefore, UPH hopes that along with its alumni in various fields, UPH can contribute towards the efforts of our country to fight against this pandemic.

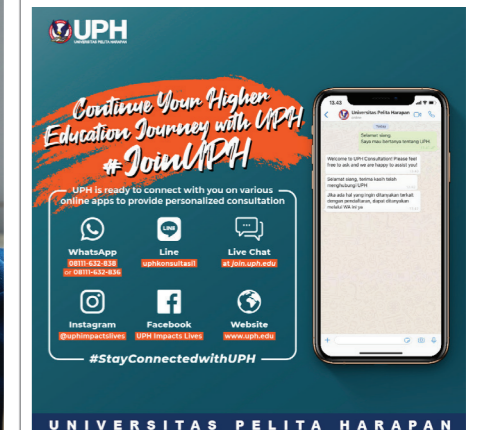

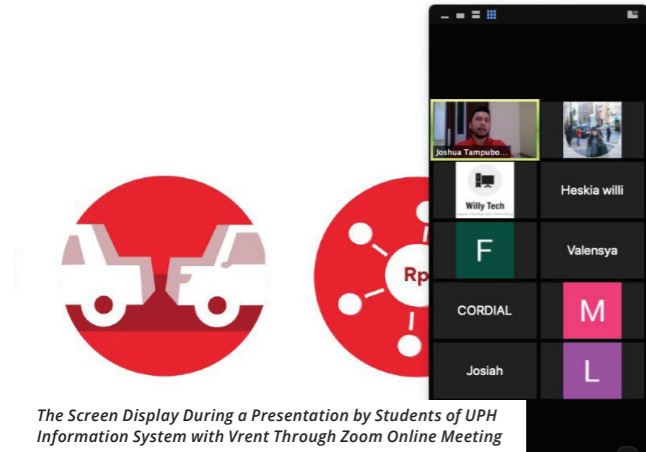

During the COVID-19 pandemic, when all lectures are carried out online, many new creative ideas soon emerge despite the pressure. One of those ideas came from the Information System Department of Universitas Pelita Harapan (UPH) who started a collaboration with Vrent, the first electric motorbike rental service start-up company in Indonesia, for their Final Project for a course subject called Multimedia and The Web which requires them to create a deliverable user experience (UX) analysis of the application. All activities, starting from lectures to assignments, are carried out online to provide students with the real experience

"For the project, students are divided into eight groups of 2-3 people. Each group will distribute an online survey to the public regarding their experience in using Vrent. All surveys and analysis will be summarized in a final report, and lastly, each group will have to present their survey results online in front of the lecturers and Vrent's leaders including Vrent's CEO (Chief Executive Officer) – Yucunto Susetyo, CTO (Chief Technology Officer) Vrent – Joshua Tampubolon, and Vrent's UI/UX Manager – Luthfi Almafidi. Each reviewer will assess and provide students with further recommendations during the online presentation and Q&A session. Hopefully, this will help students to gain feedback that corresponds to the industry needs," Calandra Alenxia Haryani, S.E., M.T.I. – Multimedia and The Web Lecturer in Information System UPH.

Joshua Tampubolon – Vrent's CTO admitted that this collaboration is a greatly beneficial step for Vrent.

"Even in the middle of this less conducive situation, we are really excited about this collaboration with UPH. The purpose of this collaboration is to give these students a real experience in developing our mobile app (Vrent), especially in dealing with the UX of our application. We are really excited to discuss and exchange ideas with UPH students," said Joshua.

Preventive measures have been constantly taken by UPH Medan through temperature checking in every entrance, hand-sanitizer provision around campus areas, daily cleaning around the campus' area, and occasional disinfecting around the Lippo Plaza Medan Campus area and Aryaduta Medan Campus.
